Description and justification of project and funding sources:

The reconstruction of Russell Street will cause evaluation of the existing 21" to 30" Russell Interceptor sewer line. Portions of the existing sewer are planned to be reconstructed or relined. Televised inspection has rated portions of the pipe for relining or reconstruction.

Design to be funded in FY2012 by Sewer R&D. Construction funding would be accomplished after final design by Sewer Replacement & Depreciation. Costs may be significantly less than shown depending on pipe condition and capacity, which will be evaluated as part of the project. The pipe may only need to be relined, which would result in significant savings.
