Summary Description and rationale of project and funding sources:						
<p>The Milwaukee Trail is the busiest designated primary commuter route in the city. The existing trail segment between Toole Park and Clark Fork Natural Area is 10' in width and in poor condition due to age, proximity to the river, and numerous past repairs. The trail conditions are marginal to substandard for the current level of use. Trail lights along this approximately 1,250' long section are aging out and in need of replacement. Existing lights are powered by direct bury wiring that has failed and been repaired many times. The lights are not dark sky compliant, do not meet adopted standards, and are threatened by river bank erosion. The trail segment will be improved and widened to 14' paved width and the trail lighting replaced. Match funding for this project is from local Transportation Impact Fees. Prior year funding is appropriated for expense in FY25 via the FY25 Parks CIP update form.</p>						
History & Current Status: Impact if Cancelled or Delayed						
<p>Trail widening and lighting upgrades are needed to address poor condition of trail asphalt, tree root damage, user safety, congestion and riverbank erosion. Project's grant funding agreement was approved by Mayor and Council. MDT has authorized funds for engineering. Cancellation or delay could affect Federal funding allocation, leverage value, and increase project scope and costs over time.</p>						
Are there any site requirements/ Potentially Affected Interest (PAI) Coordination:						
<p>Parks and Recreation is working with adjacent private property owners to amend existing easements needed to reconstruct, widen and realign the trail as well as move and replace trail lights.</p>
